Housing Supplementary Planning Document

Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulation 2004, notice is given that Eden District Council formally adopted the Housing Supplementary Planning Document on 2nd November 2010.

The Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) provides additional guidance to that already set out in Eden's Core Strategy, relating to affordable housing (which is Eden's top corporate priority) including the delivery of affordable housing in rural areas, as well as identifying standards for residential design. The Housing SPD will be a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.

Any person aggrieved by the SPD may apply to the High Court for leave to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the document. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event, not later than 3 months after the day on which it was adopted.
