Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulation 2004, notice is given that Eden District Council formally adopted the North Pennines AONB Planning Guidelines and Building Design Guide Supplementary Planning Documents on 29 July 2011.

The Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs) provide additional guidance to ensure the continued conservation of the quality and character of the North Pennines' natural and built environment. They will apply only to the North Pennines AONB and will be used as a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.

Any person aggrieved by the SPDs may apply to the High Court for leave to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the document. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event, not later than 3 months after the day on which it was adopted.
