Sports Coach Education Bursary Scheme Terms and Conditions

- Applicants must live in Eden District
- Applicants must be aged 16+
- Applicants must be or intend to be an active coach within the community of Eden
- Applicants can apply for a 50% subsidy for National Governing Body UKCC Level 1 and 2 courses only to a limit of £300
- Applicants can apply for a 50% bursary for Safeguarding and Protecting Children and First Aid courses to a limit of £50
- The bursary scheme will not fund any additional expenditure including travel, accommodation, food and refreshments associated with attending a course
- Applicants must hold a valid DBS disclosure or intend to apply for a DBS following completion of the course
- Bursaries will be awarded to individuals and not clubs
- Applicants must apply for the bursary before the start of the course
- Applicants shall complete an Application Form and submit it to the Leisure Services Team providing all information requested
- Applicants shall submit an Application Form four weeks prior to commencement of the course to enable the application to be considered
- Applicants must provide a letter or email of support from the sports club or community organisation and group to which they are associated and intend to coach at. This support shall confirm that the individual is a coach at their club/group
- The Council will pay the bursary following completion of the coaching course and upon evidence that the individual has passed the course and been certified. Failure to attend all sessions of the course or to not pass the course will result in no bursary being paid
- The personal details of those persons awarded a bursary will be maintained by the Council for monitoring purposes
- The Council withholds the right to publicise the bursary awards as deemed necessary
- The Council may wish to contact the coach in the future to offer coaching opportunities should they arise
- Applications will only be approved where there is sufficient budget available to support the request
