CAMRA, the Campaign for Real Ale, is an independent consumer organisation campaigning for real ale, community pubs and consumer rights. CAMRA is a company limited by guarantee, registered in England with company number 1270286. CAMRA's national surplus is not distributed to its members and the individual CAMRA Branch activity where the pub is nominated is wholly or partly applied to the local authority area. The local Westmorland CAMRA Branch submitting this nomination does not distribute any surplus it makes to its members in line with Section 5 of the regulations. The Westmorland CAMRA branch has a local connection as demonstrated by the following activities which are run and funded by the branch within the local authority district:

- · The Westmorland CAMRA Branch hosts a beer festival in the local area
- The Branch nominates a local pub of the year in this area.
- · The Branch presents awards to pubs in the area
- . The Branch runs campaigns to save local pubs in the area
- · The Branch writes a local newsletter about pubs and campaigns in the area
- · The Branch hosts meetings in the Stag Inn pub and the local area

The pub provides the following services which further the social wellbeing and interests of the local community:

- The pub enables local people to enjoy a range of drinks (and food) in a pleasant, convivial atmosphere, which furthers their individual well-being

- · The pub hosts advertising for local events
- . There is a beer garden attached to the pub which is used and enjoyed by local people
- . The pub has a great food menu enjoyed by the local community
- · The pub hosts regular quiz nights which bring the community together
- · Free wifi is available for customers
- A local beer festival offering a range of local beers is hosted at the pub
- There is free parking available which is accessed by the wider community
- This pub is a member of CAMRA's LocAle scheme, committed to serving locally produced real ales and meeting consumer demands for local produce
- · This is the only pub in the village
- . The Pub has been included in a tourist or local pub guide
- · There is good access for disabled people at the pub
- The pub has special value to local heritage and culture which should be protected; the Stag Inn stands at the heart of the village, overlooking the green. It was brick built in 1703, with solid oak beams. It is a highly valued part of Dufton's heritage and is a always warm and welcoming to the many walkers passing through the village on the Pennine Way. It's an old-fashioned country pub, with a cast-iron range to warm the bar, an open fireplace in the smaller lounge, and a comfortable

- dining room providing a wide choice of meals. The Stag is recognised by CAMRA and regularly listed in the Good Beer Guide.
- Meeting spaces are available for local community groups and charities to use, such as the annual shoot meetings, the annual High Cup Nick fell race and Westmorland CAMRA Branch meetings
- The pub provides other important local services to the community such as: free access to a Dart Board; employment opportunities for young people; entertainment for the local community such as regular quiz nights, regular musical events and the annual Dufton Beer Festival
- Any change of use or potential sale of this pub would have devastating consequences on the local
  community; the Stag Inn is special part of the village heritage and local community, it is the meeting
  place of numerous groups and also attracts numerous people from surrounding fellside villages
  including Knock, Murton and Hilton, all of which lack their own village pub
