Report of Local Authority Parking Account (as required by Section 55 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended)

- 5. General expenditure includes items such as the printing and distribution of a "Visitors' Guide to Parking in Eden" leaflet and public information adverts advising on the disc zone scheme and how to park correctly.
- This income includes outstanding PCN charges recovered by legal action or other enforcement.
- 7. The contract with Cumbria County Council covers services such as Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO/warden) patrols, transport costs, notice processing, the adjudication service, Traffic Enforcement Centre and DVLA charges, stationary, IT support and maintenance and handling appeals. The contract with Carlisle City Council covers the cost of collecting, auditing and banking cash from off-street parking ticket machines.
- 8. Action in respect of any surplus or deficit in the parking account is governed by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (RTRA). The Council is obliged to make good any deficit out of the general fund. The Council is obliged to use any surplus in accordance with the restrictions of Section 55 of the RTRA.
