Community Value of the Land:	Town Hall is a building demonstrating cultural interest of the town. It received Grade II listed status in 2014. The history of the building includes links to the Wordsworth family, use as the centre of civic activity during Wartime and it hosted Winston Churchill's VE day speech in 1945. A section of Town Hall served as a public library until 1992 and the museum also had its home there for several years. These services contributed to the social economic and educational wellbeing of the community. In recent years Town Hall has primarily functioned as Eden District Council's main offices and administrative centre, yet supplementary uses have included wedding ceremonies which have allowed the building to be used by the local community. This demonstrates a potential the building has in the current area and how future uses could lend themselves to cultural and artistic use and use by community groups.

	In November 2020 the council advertised a tender 'Feasibility Study for the redevelopment of Penrith Town Hall', which included scope to liaise with a range of arts and cultural sector users to ascertain an interest in a repurposed Town Hall. This demonstrates that the current owners consider Town Hall has potential to facilitate community, artistic and cultural uses in the future. Town Hall has since 1905-6 been a public building operated for and on behalf of the community.
